## **QUALITY STANDARDS AND GENERAL PROPERTIES**

Pilularis is graded as a Select or Standard grade and is normally sap free. The timber is quite hard, it dries relatively easily albeit slowly and with little degrade.

#### TYPICAL END USE APPLICATIONS

Popular for T&G Flooring as well as staircase work, its durability allows for it to be used outside but not in ground contact. It does however check and this does detract from using it for decking.

### **AVAILABILITY**

Pilularis in NZ is available in small quantities and spasmodically. Its slow drying means that 50mm can take 8-12 months to dry. So lead times to do thicker dimension is long.
