DISTRIBUTION

Small volumes of the species grow in the eastern states of Australia, but the only real commercial volumes are in the wetter districts of Tasmania. Some New Zealand grown timber is available intermittently.

QUALITY STANDARDS AND GENERAL PROPERTIES

Only Select & Better grade is imported into New Zealand, with the main sizes being 100x50, 150x25, and 150x50. In general, the average length specification tends to be short ú to have significant volumes of 600mm to 1500mm lengths in a packet is not unusual.
